It's too bad you couldn't all be at the rehearsals because, while preparing this show is particularly taxing, it is also hilarious fun. But you'll understand when you see the show. Performances will be July 25 and 26 at 8pm, August 1 and 2 at 8pm and August 3 at 2pm. Tickets are available on-line with credit card or Paypal account at www.village-players.com, or at Black's on Main Street, where you will need cash or check.

The show opens on the unit set which represents two different homes, both owned by John Smith, played by Christian Boudman. One home is where he lives with his wife, Mary, played by Kaylin Dean; and his daughter, Vicki, played by newcomer, Mara Lamb. The other home is where he lives with his wife, Barbara, played by another newcomer, Deb Gagne; and his son, Gavin, played by Vinny Amico. Both families are often on-stage together, although they are in different homes.

To add to the confusion, Ernie Bass, playing John's friend and boarder, Stanley, is coerced into trying to help John keep his two families separate, although he doesn't have a clue as to how to do that.

When Stanley's doddering father, played by Russ Ellis, shows up at the door, the comedy is ramped up another notch. Author, Ray Cooney, has produced another rollicking farce that is even funnier than its predecessor, *Run For Your Wife*. He takes ordinary characters and puts them into extraordinary circumstances which lead them deeper and deeper into riotous hilarity.

Director, Carol Bense, is being assisted by Jay Sydow, who knows how to "up the funny" as we say.

Joshua Spaulding is producing for the first time although he has excelled at many other production positions. Jay Sydow also designed the set, which was quite challenging, given our small stage.

Laura Cooper will be serving as Stage Manager with Christie Sarles assisting. Laura is also in charge of props. Barbara Wilson is doing publicity and Gay-Ann Cooney will be House Manager. Matthew Johnson is taking care of lights and sound and Chrystal Gavreau will be in charge of Make-up. Jeanette D'Onofrio designed the logo and Jerome Holden will produce the banner.

Several others will be helping, but their names are not available yet.

"I just want everyone to know how much I appreciate all the help in making this show work," said director, Carol Bense. "Any production is a group effort and this one requires all our efforts, but I think our audiences will find the results extremely entertaining and funny."
