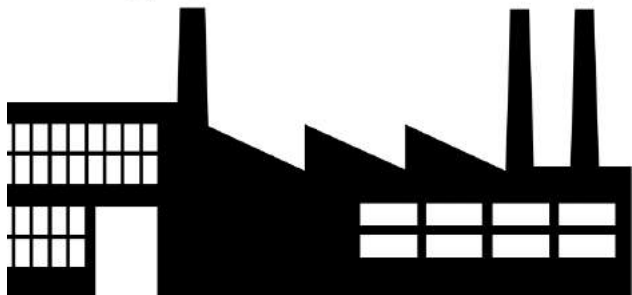

Union, representative, Babe, vows “I’m Not At All In Love,” but she falls for the new superintendent, Sid, who can’t believe he is smitten as he sings “Hey There!” The workers are “Racing With the Clock” while Hines, the time-study man keeps his stop watch on them singing “Think of the Time I Save,” but they get a break at the company picnic on their “Once a Year Day.” Gladys and her pals show off with a funky rendition of “Steam Heat,” and then everyone has an exciting evening at “Hernando’s Hideaway.”

Performances are scheduled for **November 9, 10, 16 and 17 at 8pm with matinees on November 11 and 18 at 2pm**. Tickets are available at Black’s Paper and Gifts on downtown Main Street in Wolfboro or on-line at www.village-players.com.

The 30th anniversary committee of The Village Players is organizing a group trip to Boston to see SPAMALOT January 20th for the Sunday matinee. We will be traveling by bus from Wolfeboro.

"SPAMALOT" is the hilarious, highly acclaimed musical which has been playing on Broadway for several years and is based on the famous Monty Python film, "The Holy Grail." The winner of the 2005 Tony Award for Best Musical, "SPAMALOT" tells the legend of King Arthur and his knights of the round table, with "a bevy of beautiful show girls, not to mention cows, killer rabbits and french people."

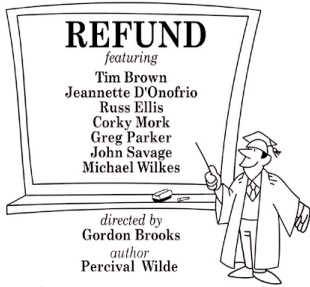

As a project, the three picked short comedies which were presented on August 24 and 25 at our theater. Village Players members were invited to come to the productions free of charge and general public cost was \$5.



Audiences were fairly small, but 70 folks did come and pay to see the shows, and about 35 Village Players members came as well. The audiences were very responsive, especially the Saturday night audience, who had the added excitement of a town-wide power outage at about 7pm. We told the audience we would wait until 8:30, but if the power did not come back on, we would not be able to do the show and would refund their money. The audience members were so supportive that they told us they weren't leaving until we put on the show no matter what. Well, luckily it didn't come to a showdown since the power came back on at 8:05pm much to the relief of the directors and actors.
