The Village Players is performing *Truth and Consequences* by Daris Howard at our theater on Glendon Street. Performances will be at 6pm, 8pm, and 10pm. Entrance is by "First Night" button only. These can be purchased from the Chamber of Commerce or at various stores in town.

As usual, we will be doing a melodrama to keep everyone on their toes. The heroine's father has died leaving an intriguing will. He left his fortune to his daughter, but no one knows where or what it is. The hero and his friends, Beaker and Charlie, have to find it before the villain and his cohort.

Beaker has created a truth potion, which the villain wants to use against the hero in a debate as they run against each other for mayor, but the tables are turned. The fun comes from learning that sometimes even the truth is better left unsaid.

The cast for this romp features Bob Tuttle as Frank, our young and handsome hero who always tells the truth; James Cross as Charlie, the ornery cowhand; Travis Lawrence-Hurt as Beaker, the nerdy genius type; Christian Boudman as Hobart, the coniving villain; Kalin Jordan as Adeline, our young and innocent heroine; Pat Parent (her first time on stage) as Bertha Barton, the tough and bossy villainess; Kimberly Brenion (back with VP after a long absence) as Josie Barton, Bertha's nerdy daughter; Judy Gallagher (her first speaking role) as Judy the judge.

These dresses contrasted perfectly with the outrageous orange and green of the stepsisters (Lisa Rose Penny and Jen Gagne) and the beautiful pale blue gown wore by Cinderella (Katelyn Parker).

Jay Sydow led the set construction and design. Once again, the limited space of our stage was utilized to its maximum potential. Young and old alike were delighted by the fire that lit magically, a giant story book with turning pages as a back drop and a cozy cottage that Megan Rohrbacher's crew could roll in and out in just seconds.

Music director Keith Belanger helped create an ensemble sound of brilliant harmonies and enjoyed working with soloists whose voices were top-notch. With just a few rehearsals, he led the pit band to a sound that enhanced almost every moment of the production.

Of course, you can't talk about the production without mentioning the talent performing on the stage. We were lucky to find some new faces, voices and dancing feet for this show. Katelyn Parker played Cinderella with a "Disney Princess" voice and genuine sweetness. We hope to hang onto Katelyn
