# UNDECLARED HISTORY AUDITIONS

Russ Ellis will be directing our Spring production, *Undeclared History*, by Isaac Rathbone. Auditions will be held on Sunday, January 6th and Sunday, January 13th at 7pm at our theater on Glendon Street. Everyone is invited to audition. If you cannot be at either of these auditions, please email Russ at ram2sk@aol.com or or call him at 569-9218. He wants to be sure that anyone interested has the opportunity to audition.

The production will be staged in a "black box" that will be built on our stage and rehearsals will be on Sunday nights and Wednesday or Thursday nights, whichever works out best for the cast.

Undeclared History is about a Vietnam vet who returns from the war in the late 1960's and goes to college under the GI bill, and his interactions with the college students of the day. The play was originally set at Hofstra University, but the author has committed to change the script so that the setting will be "some generic new england college". Isaac has also said that he would like to come to Wolfeboro early in rehearsals to talk about "character" and do a "talk back" with the audience after a performance. Our production will be the New England premiere of his play.

The characters in the play are as follows: Diana - female student, muted Finn - male commuter student, Vietnam vet, missing left arm

Maeve - female activist, flambouyant, radical Hector - male, Black Panther, wears an "afro" Jason - male, varsity athlete, fraternity member Mentor - female, professor, the voice of reason Trickster - male, shape-shifter, deviant and cunning, takes on several roles
Chorus - male and female, a group of students who vary in styles, races and genders. They also serve as guerilla troupe members, musicians, etc.

We hope you will consider auditioning, even if you have never done anything on stage. We would love to work with you. If you would prefer to work on some other aspect of the production, please let Russ know. He certainly can use your skills, whatever they may be.



# Annual Meeting and Election

Our Annual Meeting and Election was held after the performance on Sunday, November 11th. Here is a word from our President, Diane Mork.

The Village Players has been working on the theater all year in small projects. We had electrical work done so now most of the theater wiring has been updated and expanded for future use. The front railings have been sanded and repainted and much of the trim that's hard to reach has been painted. We have just hired an insulation company to insulate the floor of the "Poobah" room and the ceiling over the blue and green rooms. This should really cut down on our heating bills and pay for itself very quickly. We're hoping this will be completed by the end of December.

Glamour in Mud Season in April proved to be a successful fundraiser for us and plans are under way for another successful event in March of 2013.

Next year will be our 35th anniversary so look for upcoming details in The Prompter about celebration plans.

### \$\$ DUES ARE GOING UP \$\$

Just like everything else, Village Players' dues are going up for 2013. Everything costs more, and expenses for the theater are no exception. BUT you can save a few bucks if you pay your 2013 dues before January 1, 2013. Right now dues are \$12 for an individual and \$20 for a family. As of January 1, 2013 they will be \$15 for an individual and \$25 for a family.

Several years ago the board decided that any dues paid after September 1 of a given year, would be applied to the following year. For example, if you pay your dues now (at \$12 or \$20) you will be a paid up member for 2013. If you wait until after December 31st, you will have to pay \$15 or \$25 to be a paid up member for 2013. So save yourself some money and pay now.

We always welcome new members. Use the email address to let us know if you would like to participate in any aspect of theater. We love to see new faces both on stage and off.



Debbie was also an accomplished weaver, being a member of several prestigious weaving organizations, and having her work juried and sold at the League of New Hampshire Craftsmen.


Always pleasant and kind, Debbie will be sorely missed by all the Village Players. A memorial service is being held at the theater on November 30th at 2pm.
