Theresa Crowell has the job of house manager, and Jeannette D'Onofrio is managing publicity. Helen Rautenberg is doing make-up with help from Delina Bickford and Missy Shure. Carol Bense takes care of tickets.

We are always glad to see new faces in our shows and this time we have three. Rick Tessari will debut with the Village Players in the role of Tony, the boss's son. Also taking his first steps on our stage will be

Michael Ray Parcels filling the role of Ed, Alice's brother-in-law. And we have Jerry Vasil in the role of Donald, the cook's boyfriend. Not quite new to Village Players is Board Member, Dick Cary, but I believe this is his first on-stage appearance with us as he takes the role of Mr. DePinna.



In addition, we have some of our veterans in this show. Carol Bense plays Mrs. Sycamore, Gordon Brooks takes the role of Mr. Sycamore, and Corky Mork is Grampa. Mr. and Mrs. Kirby, Tony's parents are James Cross and Willie Mork. Jackie Witham, who hasn't been with us for a while, plays the struggling Alice. Her sister Essie is played by Jen Bruce. Suzanne Esper is Rheba, and Athena Ellis is Gay Wellington. The Grand Duchess Olga is played by Joyce Wood. Jim Pittman plays the flustered IRS agent, Mr. Henderson, and Dan Charlton fills the role of Mr. Kohlenkov. The government agents are played by Gerry Theodora, Bob Rautenberg and Russ Ellis.

Jim Pittman - Member-at-Large

Jim Pittman is a relative newcomer to the world of community theater. Four years ago, Holderness' Little Church Theater was staging its first ever production. While collecting his mail at the local post office, the director offered Jim the role of a nefarious real estate developer. As every actor knows, it's impossible to resist the chance to play the villain, and so, Jim's theater career was launched.

Since then, he has appeared in the Village Players productions of *I Never Sang for my Father*, *The Sound of Music*, and worked as a stage hand for *The Pajama Game*. In 2003 he served a production role for the movie "Below the Belt", which screened at The Sundance Film Festival the next year.

Jim's main performance experience has been as a musician, having played the guitar since he was a teenager. 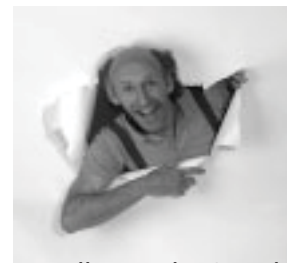
