

...DIRECTOR'S NOTE...

When I decided to produce and direct this play, I never realized it would affect me so much. While doing research on Anne and the seven others who occupied the Secret Annex, I felt like I was getting to know these brave people and to understand all the fears and anxieties they must have felt during WWII.

And what can I say about Anne? Here was a girl with every little girl's dreams, hopes and desires. "I'm going to be famous some day," she noted, and her dreams have come through beautifully. The diary that she received for her thirteenth birthday germinated into a book, a play and a movie and then won the 1956 Pultizer Prize. The book itself has circulated through many countries and has become the second most read book in the world next to the Bible.

It has been a great experience for me directing this play, and many in the cast have come up with some great stories and history about the people they are portraying that lived in the Secret Annex for over two years. These eight people, and all the others that died during WWII, are the true heroes of war along with the helping hands that brought them supplies and food in order to survive. But did they survive? Well, as far as I'm concerned, they all did, as they are still in the hearts of all people who read books for history or see *Anne's* own words come alive on the stage.

As this has been my first full-length production as a director, I must say that I could have never done it without the help of my Assistant Director, the one and only Carol Bense. I attended her Director's Workshop years ago and hoped that some day I would be able to direct a show. Along with a great crew and set, it certainly helped my dreams come true.


Weston Dean (Mr. VanDaan)
